## A thought for the birds...




Consider our feathered friends by providing them with a birdbath in your garden. One plunked in the middle of a lawn won't do. Birds first need to go to a perch nearby to check out their surroundings, so set the bath beside a tree, fence or tall shrub. The shade will help keep water fresher, but do change it a couple of times a week and give the container a good scrubbing. This will eliminate bacteria and suppress mosquito breeding.

## **Biochar for Animal Welfare**

During YREA's continuing research of biochar, we discovered that a large part of the biochar produced in Europe is used in farming to improve the health of livestock.

Biochar can suppress intestinal pathogens, deactivating toxins already in digestive systems when used in feed formulas for cattle, poultry and other farm animals.

Biochar's high adsorbent quality, when added to litter, locks in moisture and nitrogen compounds, reducing odours and emissions of ammonia as well as footpad diseases.

YREA is particularly interested in further study and development of this use of biochar for the improvement of animal health and welfare and the reduction of agricultural GHGE. What a valuable tool for farmers seeking to implement more sustainable practices!
